NATURE OF WORK:

These positions are located in the Outpatient Pharmacy of the Pharmacy Department. The Pharmacy Technicians assist Pharmacists in preparing and distributing medications, maintaining the drug inventory, and maintaining patient records. The Pharmacy Technicians work only under the supervision of a Registered Pharmacist and do not perform duties that can legally be performed by a Registered Pharmacist. Pharmacy Technicians use precision and attention to detail to ensure sage and accurate dispensing of medications.

DUTIES:

- 1. Process prescription and handle completed orders per providers request, pharmacist request, or prearranged work assignment according to established policies, procedures, and protocols.
 - Work the registers at Outpatient Pharmacy
 - Take prescription for customers and review for authenticity.
 - Handle completed orders to customers.
 - Ring up over the counter (OTC) and medical prescription (Rx) sales for customers.
 - Responsible for reviewing and researching entered claims, assisting in adjudication, working, and resolving unpaid claims, generating patient statements, and maintaining accounts receivable records.
 - Evaluates account and prepares adjustments to refund payments and correct discrepancies as necessary.
 - Performs manual and/or electronic processing of claims in a prompt and timely manner.
 - Submit accurate and timely claims (CMS 1500 etc.).
 - Maintains and applies knowledge of current requirements relating to Medicare, Medicaid and other third-party insurances.
 - Addresses insurance, reimbursement, and payment issues as appropriate by communication with insurance, providers, patients, and pharmacists.
 - Verifies benefits and eligibility and submits prior authorizations as needed.
 - Maintains accurate records of outstanding claims and/or past due balances.
 - Prepares reports by summarizing information.
 - Maintain correct patient records and documentation of all correspondence and status (i.e., recording and filling Prior Authorizations).
 - Identifies and assists patients who may qualify for patient assistance programs or copay assistance.
 - Protect patient confidentiality, according to HIPAA guidelines.
- 2. Maintains adequate stock of medications and supplies according to established policies and procedures.
 - Receives and record shipments to the pharmacy.
 - Performs in ordering, receiving, unpacking, and storing medications and supplies in appropriate locations.

- Rotates stock to ensure use before expiration date.
- Identifies and replaces outdated and unusable medications.
- Restocks medication accurately within specified time periods.
- Repackages bulk medications in unit-dose packages safely and accurately per established procedures using appropriate techniques.
- 3. Contributes to the effective operation of the department
 - Receives and record prescription orders, requisitions, and medications.
 - Reviews prescription orders and enters information into the pharmacy computer system accurately.
 - Enters charges and credits for patient medications accurately.
 - Ensure customers are happy and served in a quick manner as part of CHCC's customer service goal.
 - Generates reports, pick lists, and labels as required.
 - Answers the telephone, identifying self and department. Directs calls to appropriate personnel.
 - Answers customers' requests at the window and provides good customer service.
 - Organizes and prioritizes work assignments given.
 - Maintains logs, records, and other required documentation accurately. Files documentation in appropriate locations.
 - Demonstrates good oral and written communication.
 - Keeps the pharmacy areas clean, neat, and well-organized. Keeps pharmacy equipment clean.
- 4. Participates in the quality improvement activities of the department.
 - Completes and documents all assigned medication storage area inspections at least monthly.
 - Identifies and replaces outdated and unusable medications.
 - Collects data, conducts quality monitors, and completes documentation as assigned.
 - Participates and supports department initiatives, meetings, and training of staff.
- 5. Maintains competence required for current job title/position.
 - Maintains current technician certification.
 - Attends pharmacy staff meetings.
 - Participates in orientation, education, and training programs. Reviews literature and other materials as assigned.
 - Completes all competence/skills assessment requirements.
- 6. Performs other related duties as assigned.

Pharmacy technicians shall not perform the following functions at any time:

- 1. Consultation with the doctor regarding the patient and his prescription.
- 2. Receipt of a verbal or telephone prescription other than refill approval or denial from a practitioner.
- 3. Consultation with the patient regarding the prescription, both prior to and after the prescription filling and/or regarding any information contained in a patient medication record system.
- 4. Interpretation and identification of the contents of the prescription document.
- 5. Determination of the product required for the prescription.
- 6. Extemporaneous compounding of the prescription whereby the accuracy, correct procedure, and preparation, and safety of pharmaceutical constituents cannot be verified by the pharmacist.
- 7. Interpretation of data in a patient medication record system.
- 8. Dispense prescriptions to patients.
- 9. Final checks on all aspects of the completed prescription and assumption of the responsibility for the filled prescription, including but not limited to accuracy of the drug strength, the labeling, and the proper container provided that a pharmacy technician may perform specialized functions as approved by the Board.
- 10. Any duty required by law, rule, or regulation to be performed only by a pharmacist.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Education: High School Diploma, General Education Development (GED), Advanced Development Institute (ADI), or Adult Basic Education (ABE).

Experience: One (1) year of experience in Pharmacy.

Other: Must be licensed as a Pharmacy Technician by the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Health Care Professional Licensing Board (CNMI HCPLB).

KNOWLEDGE/SKILL/ABILITIES:

- Customer and Personal Service Knowledge of principles and processes for providing customer and personal services. This includes customer needs assessment, meeting quality standards for services, and evaluation of customer satisfaction. Pharmacy Assistants work directly with customers in person and on the phone. Being friendly and approachable and willing to help are important traits to the job.
- Clerical Skills- Pharmacy Assistants restock supplies and keep accurate records of what materials are coming in and out of the pharmacy. In addition, they use different machines and applications in the pharmacy.
- Math Skills- Pharmacy Technicians must have basic math skills to perform their duties.
- Computer- Must be able to operate computer and other pharmacy software.
- Communication- Must have great listening and speaking skills.

CONDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

Employment is contingent upon successful clearing of pre-employment health screening and drug screening in accordance with CHCC policy.

OTHERS:

This position is a Full-Time employment status and requires at least 40 hours per week. This position is "Non-Exempt" or is eligible to receive overtime compensation pursuant to the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) of 1938 Federal Law. Regular operating hours of the Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation will be Monday to Friday from 7:30am to 4:30pm. This work schedule however is subject to change with or without notice based on the Employer's business requirement and/or by the demands of the employee's job. This position is paid on a bi-weekly basis (2-week period). CHCC adheres to all applicable deductions such as C.N.M.I. Tax, Federal Tax, Medicare and Social Security.

Note(s):
